BBBEE Benefits for Indlela Supporters : One of the simplest and effective ways of earning BBBEE points is to increase the level of spending on Socio-Economic Development (SED) or Corporate Social Investment (CSI). Companies will gain not only by earning these valuable BBBEE points but will also build an enviable reputation through active involvement in uplifting society. CSI is one of the seven elements of the scorecard focusing on the extent to which an organisation carries out initiatives intended to uplift our society. It is worth 25 points for a Qualifying Small Enterprise and 5 points for a Generic company.

How we can help you? Indlela is wholly dependent on donor funding and is an accredited non-profit organisation. Donations are tax deductible and a tax certificate will be issued for inclusion in tax returns. These donations also qualify companies to score BBBEE points as follows:

Size of Company	No. Of Points	Amount
>R5mil and <R35mil per annum	25	1.5% Nett Profit After Tax
> R35mil per annum	5	1.5% Nett Profit After Tax

Example: a company that makes R10mil turnover and R500k NPAT, will earn 25 BBBEE points by donating a nominal R7 500.

We understand the preference for companies to be involved in specific interventions and it is useful to know that Indlela's activities include school support, education, early childhood development, care for orphaned and vulnerable children, feeding, entrepreneurship, youth development and leadership training.
